- All allied health
- All visiting medical specialists
- Researchers
- SEWB program staff
- Health Promotion / Population Health staff
- All upskilling and education providers
- KAMS non clinical staff
- NDIS program staff
- KRS visiting staff

Contact will be made with all non-essential services with plans to maintain a service to patients in remote communities via telehealth.
